From the Rabbi Beth D. Davidson

By the time you are reading this column, it will be a month since the historic agreement in Israel regarding pluralistic worship at the Kotel-the Western Wall. As many of you know, the site venerated by Jews for millennia has been segregated by gender: men on one side of a mechitza, and women on the other.

Anyone who has been fortunate enough to visit Israel has. I am sure, stood at the Wall, and perhaps placed a prayer in one of the cracks. You may well have heard a formal worship service on the men's side, but nothing communal on the women's side. The struggle for women's prayer, and subsequently egalitarian prayer, has taken decades.

This fight began in December, 1988, when 70 women who had been attending the International Jewish Feminist Conference wanted to pray together in community. They went to The Wall, with a Torah

Scroll, and prayed together on the women's side.

These women then became the core of "Women of the Wall," a group dedicated Robinson's Arch, an archeological site to supporting women's worship in this holy place.

in the hands of an ultra-orthodox group, Women of the Wall were refused permission to worship together; numerous laws were passed in the Knesset, until finally, in April 2003, the Israeli Supreme Court ruled in favor of a government ban which prohibited women from reading Torah or wearing tallit or tefillin at the main public area at the Wall.

Since then, there have been wellpublicized instances of women being arrested for wearing tallitot and carrying a Torah, as well as men being arrested for physical violence against women worshippers, and vandalism against the women's side.

The 2003 Supreme Court ruling required the Government to find an alternate site for women who wished to worship, and plans to provide a small prayer site at around the corner from the traditional Kotel site, were suggested.

Due to the fact that control of the Wall is The Robinson's Arch area was inaugurated as prayer site in 2004; since then, Women of the Wall, B'not Mitzvah celebrations, and Conservative and Reform

mixed gender groups have used the Robinson's Arch site.

Because this site isn't really part of THE WALL, some members of Women of the Wall have continued to break the law by attempting to worship in the women's section, with tallitot, Torah scrolls, and formal services.

By 2013, their arrests, as well as significant pressure from Jews living in the Diaspora, led the Israeli Government to require a legal solution. This is the background to the recent agreement.

So the dramatic announcement over pluralistic worship being achieved at the Kotel is, I believe, actually a misnomer. True, an agreement was reached with the Reform and Conservative movements and Women of the Wall, but what it does is to re-designate and upgrade the Robinson's Arch area for egalitarian prayer services (men & women together) and women's minyanim.

As Rabbi Uri Regev, Director of Hiddush-an Israeli organization dedicated to achieving religious liberty and equality-wrote in a recent column, which discussed both pros and cons of this new agreement, for some

> "....[t]he agreement represents a betrayal of the original values and mission of the Women of the Wall. as well as to other Modern Orthodox women who are interested in dignified prayer options in the women's section of the traditional Kotel plaza.

> The agreement explicitly strengthens the ultra-Orthodox control of the prayer area at the 'traditional' section of the Kotel, and therefore creates greater obstacles for the women who wish to stay in that area...."

It would be sad, and ironic indeed, if this agreement, which in theory came about to provide freedom to worship for women, actually ends up restricting them even further.

So the question with which I am left is: does the Liberal world accept this deal,

abandoning our hopes for true equality at the Wall, or do we say "Thank you but no thanks, we will not agree to sit at the back of the bus"—that is, accepting Robinson's Arch and not the actual Wall wall.

Do we take what we can get? Do we celebrate, as the Reform and Conservative Movements are doing? Do we end all efforts for actual access to the Kotel, and do we accept this as sufficient progress?

I don't have an answer, but if you are interested in learning more, please consider going to the websites of Women of the Wall, and Hiddush, as well as ARZA and the World Union for Progressive Judaism. You will find all sides of the argument represented, and can decide for yourself where you will stand ...

The activities of the student, both curricular and extracurricular, will be a strong consideration.


The premise of the essay is as follows:

- 2. During the selection process, the name and address of the writer and his/her parents will be concealed.
- 3. Essays must be typed, double spaced, and placed in a sealed envelope marked
- "Samuel Sugerman Scholarship Essay."
- 4. Essays must be received at the Temple Office by the close of the business day on **Thursday**, June 2, 2016..
- 5. The winner of the \$500 cash award will be announced at the Brotherhood Annual Meeting and BBQ on **Tuesday, June 7, 2016** and the presentation will be made that night.
- 6. Each applicant must be a member of a TAY family in good standing.
- 7. Each applicant must be between high school senior age and 25 years of age.



Sisterhood Book Discussion: Dora Bruder by Modiano

Everyone is welcome to the Sisterhoodsponsored book discussion at TAY on **Tuesday night, April 12, at 7 PM.**

The book selected for discussion is Patrick Modiano's *Dora Bruder*, by the 2014 winner of the Nobel Prize for Literature, available in a 2015 paperback translation from the original French.

This book is brief, filled with mystery, and driven by occupation France's complicity in the deportation and death of Jewish French citizens.

The missing person announcement from Paris-Soir, December 31, 1941, "fifteen year old Dora Bruder is missing" inspires Modiano's 1997 book.

Who was she, this Jewish teenager in Nazi-occupied Paris?

How does Modiano's quest honor the Jews whose lives and stories Nazis and French collaborators erased?

In Modiano's mystery, the author remembers—in photographs, letters, news reports, and maps—a time that France wished to forget.

Join the discussion, which will be led by Dr. Nona Fienberg, Professor Emerita at Keene State College.

Nona Fienberg was Chair of the Holocaust and Genocide Studies Department, and longtime member of the Advisory Council of The Cohen Center for Holocaust and Genocide Studies.


